Transcultural Mediations: European Heritage and Identity Discourses in the long 20th Century

Throughout the rapturous twentieth century in Europa, poets, writers, artists and scholars have functioned as (un)intentional mediators in processes of conflict-resolution, reconciliation and mutual understanding, crossing, questioning and bridging the political and cultural gaps between East and West. They were constantly engaged in renegotiating national and transnational (thus indeed European) identities and memories of a continent in upheaval. The significance of these transcultural mediations in literature, art and academia remains underexplored to this day. The *Graduiertenkolleg* brings together scholars from various countries and academic disciplines to explore such discourses – in and beyond art from the 1900s to the early 2000s with a particular focus on the often truly transnational resp. transcultural biographies and (artistic) imaginations of the mediators themselves (i.e. writers, scholars, translators, activists). The projects discussed reconstruct cases of intentional and unintentional mediation and cross-cultural representations of European avant-garde and modernism movements from the pre-WWI era to the present – an era in which globalized and digitalized discourses are currently change and challenging European national, transnational and transcultural mappings and imaginations in unforeseen ways.
